Help “De-Stress” Your Children

Back-to-school season, while exciting, can be upsetting for young students. They may worry about facing new teachers, classrooms, and classmates. Other children feel stressed because of busy schedules or high expectations that they or their parents set.

Preteens report that school, homework and grades are their top causes of stress. Feeling like they have to be perfect just adds to some children’s anxiety. Signs of perfectionism include being afraid to fail or take risks, never being satisfied with one’s success, feeling insecure, and lacking flexibility. Here are some tips for helping children realize when “good enough” is good enough.

Encourage children to enjoy the process rather than just the outcome. Emphasize that the important part of school is to have fun learning, practicing, and doing, rather than being an immediate expert. It’s okay to dream big, regardless of the outcome.

Provide age-appropriate tasks to build confidence. To prevent frustration and getting “stuck,” show children how to tackle achievable tasks one at a time.

Accept “good enough” yourself. Try not to dwell on children’s mistakes. Offer many more comments about what they’re doing right than about what they’re doing wrong. Talk about times you’ve done your best and been satisfied with a less-than-perfect outcome.

Share ways that God is our sturdy foundation. Talk about why a creation of blocks or LEGOS will always fall down and why our efforts to be perfect will always fail. Talk about times when you have stood tall in Christ.

Ask God:

1. To help your children have positive school year.
2. To help you and your children manage life’s stresses.
3. To help you resist the urge to be a “perfect” parent.

“Give all your worries and cares to God, for he cares about you.” 1 Peter 5:7

Jesus warns that his followers will face earthly trials, but he also promises to protect and comfort us. Because our loving God is in control, we can put all our anxieties on his shoulders.

Teachable Moments.

Puzzled – Work together on a jigsaw puzzle and talk about the challenges of putting all the pieces of a puzzle—and life—together. Read aloud Luke 1:37 (*“For nothing is impossible with God.”*) and discuss how Jesus helps us solve even the toughest problems.

Lift Your Hearts – With a permanent marker, draw a heart on a hard-boiled egg. Pour ½ cup salt into a paper cup with “Jesus” written the side. Fill a clear jar half full of water. Hold the egg so everyone can see the heart. Say: “Sometimes our hearts feel heavy with worries. What are some worries you have?” As you drop the egg into the jar of water, say: “Worries make our hearts sink inside us. But Jesus can take away those worries. Pour the salt into the jar and stir the water for a while. Read aloud Matthew 11:28 – 20. (*“Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.”*) When the egg rises to the top and floats, say: “When we give our worries to Jesus, our hearts become lighter.”



MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Do you find it interesting, as I do, that God has made us different in so many ways? Looking around the church I see that

some of us are short, others tall; some of us wear glasses, others don't, some of us like sports, some of us like to fish and hunt, others like computers. Some of us like and are good at music while others aren't. God has given us different interests, talents, desires, and gifts. God also gives us different careers. He made us carpenters, business people, doctors, plumbers, teachers, etc. We don't look or sound alike, but as Christians we do have much in common. As God's children, we believe that He has created us and loves us so much that He sent His Son to die for each of us. We know that He calls and knows us by name, and we are united in our faith.

As God's people, we also have a common task as Ephesians 4:12 states, "*that the body of Christ may be built up.*" God in His infinite wisdom allows us to choose how to serve Him best. As we contemplate how best we can serve the Lord, it is good to remember that God will empower us so we can faithfully use our God-given talents for His kingdom. God didn't make us and give us so much without giving us, as well, the ability to make a difference in our church, community, and the world. God will always equip us for the tasks He gives us to do. Think of the account of the tongue-tied Moses whom God equipped to be the

leader of a vast nation. Study the life of David, an obscure shepherd boy, whom God prepared to be king. Marvel at God's patience with Gideon who asked for test after test before he was confident enough to undertake the task God entrusted him. We might find new situations and challenges to be a bit risky or uncomfortable, but just as God was with Moses, David, and Gideon, He will be with us all the way. With His help, we will find ways our time and talents can make a difference.

Ephesians 4:16 reads, "*From Him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.*" It is important and essential that we do our parts to support the body of Christ. We could easily compare this to a basketball team, which requires the contribution of each player. The guards need to bring the ball down the court, run the offense, make the correct passes and contribute in scoring. The forwards need to rebound and score, along with the center. All of the positions have to contribute on defense. Each team members plays a unique role and is valuable to the team. If one of them fails to contribute, the whole team suffers. We each have a part to contribute on God's team. We can be effective in reaching the unchurched and building up the church when we all contribute. God gives us talents and gifts so we can use them to His glory in His church. When we let God work through us, we can make a difference.

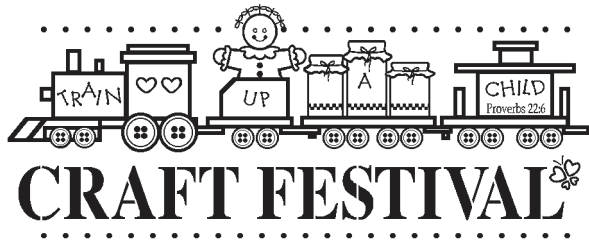
This is an important fact for all Sunday school teachers, leaders and parents to keep in mind. It is important because it is one of the factors that influence how our children feel about Sunday school. If children and youth have developed friendships with other kids within their Sunday school classes, they will be much more likely to remain active and enthusiastic about Sunday school. And, by encouraging children to build new friendships within our Sunday schools and to bring their friends with them, we will see our Sunday school grow!

Here at Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd we will strive to continually improve the Sunday school experience and as part of our lessons:

- We provide plenty of opportunities for children to talk together with a partner or in a trio. And have the children switch every so often so they're exposed to more than the same group of children each time.
- We make "friendship appreciation" a regular part of the class experience.
- We use Scriptures that depict friendships and the importance in the lessons.
- We make our classrooms a "friends-first" classroom. Any visitors are welcomed and if age appropriate, have an automatic partner (a volunteer ambassador).
- We will be sending a "missed you" card for children that are absent from class for an extended period and let that child know they are prayed for.
- As we all know most children love to talk, so we tap into this propensity by giving them a chance to talk about why friendship is important and how we should treat our friends.

Although children this age experience fluid relationships with one another, there can still be a strong bonding that takes place. By emphasizing that friendships are important and that everyone belongs, the children will build the foundations for strong friendships in the years to come.

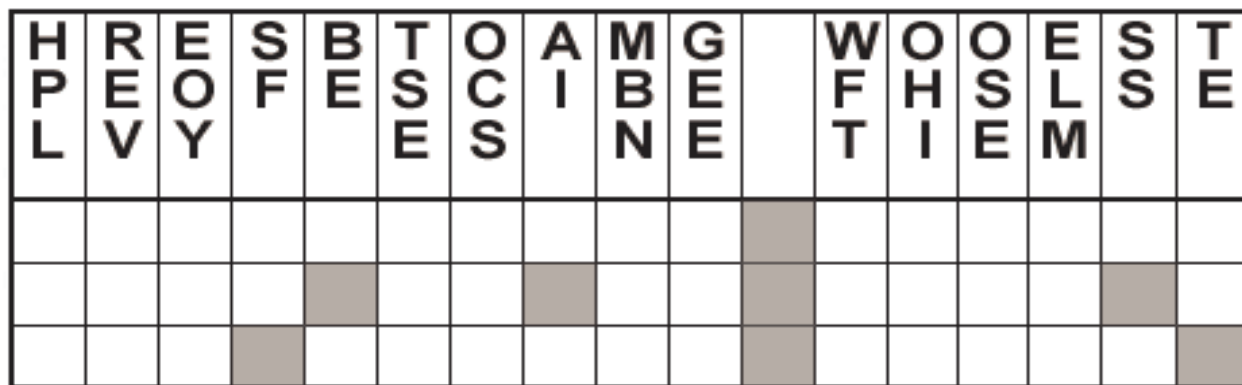

The next Sub Shoppe is October 10th.

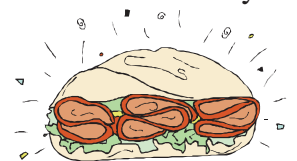

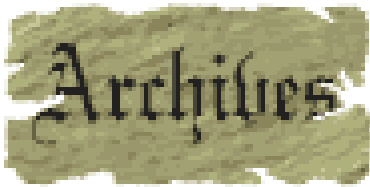
YOUTH MUSIC MINISTRY CHOIRS AT GOOD SHEPHERD

The **Cherub Choir** is beginning for the PK-K and is a new outlet for musical expression which incorporates upbeat, Scripture based songs. Music will be taught during the Sunday School class by the Music Ministry Team and sung in church once a month. Children are also taught proper worship etiquette and honoring service to the Lord. Parents and family members are invited and encouraged to attend worship service to hear their little Cherubs sing! This new music opportunity begins on October 3.

The **Shepherd Singers** are comprised of youth in grades 6-12 and introduces a more modern approach to praise and vocal worship. Music and worship education is continued with this choir and they participate in worship twice a month with a balance of contemporary Christian music and a cappella pieces. This choral opportunity enhances the spiritual development of our young people and gives glory to the Lord in worship. The **Shepherd Singers** begin rehearsals on Wednesday evenings starting December 1 from 6:00-6:45.



The **Joyful Ringers** are a beginner-intermediate hand bell choir for grades 5-12 that introduces proper bell technique, music vocabulary, composition and preliminary music theory. This choir plays during worship 3-4 times per year. The ability to read music is not a prerequisite but it is helpful. All skills and techniques will be taught during rehearsals. This choir begins rehearsals on Wednesday evenings starting December 1 from 6:45-7:30.
